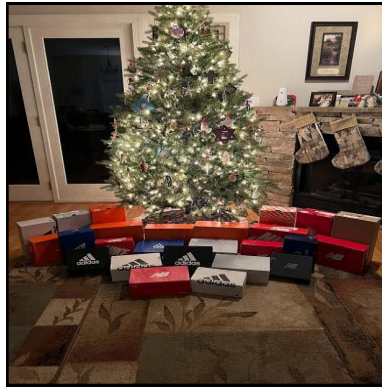

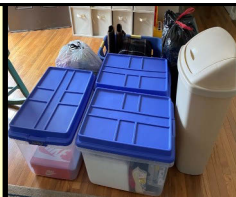
SOME RECENT NEEDS MET BY OUR MISSIONS
